



Synopsis

Imagine if "Hinterland Who's Who" and "The Muppets" had a baby. *Northern Tails* takes its cue from beloved classics, but with an original spin and timely environmental themes that makes facts fun with zany characters, physical comedy and amusing plot twists.

Over each 10-minute episode, Russell Perry, a ground squirrel and documentary filmmaker, tells stories of iconic wildlife and ecosystems in the Boreal Forest. Russell is a consummate observer and his subjects are rarely aware of his presence. Through his documentary lens, we eavesdrop on their lives, learning about them, the forest and how they relate to us. As ground squirrels, Russell and his crew encounter calamity (and danger) in every one of their shoots, keeping the audience informed and always entertained.

Each episode wraps up with a "field guide" segment that highlights key facts about each species and directs audiences to a website for more online learning and engagement.



Audiences

CHILDREN

Our target audience is children aged 6-11 an age where kids seek independent knowledge, but physical humor is still appreciated.

PARENTS

Subtle references and the overall retro aesthetic will trigger nostalgia for parents aged 35-50.

CONTENT SURFERS

The overall production value and the unique presentation of this series is intended to catch the eye of content surfers looking for new things to watch online.





Comparables

The original inspiration for this series came from *Storm & Tinde*, a Swedish short that used puppets to explain the natural history of arctic foxes. But we wanted to go beyond a basic narration and hear from the animals themselves, so we drew from the shows we loved from our own childhoods — *The Muppet Show, Fraggle Rock*, and contemporary animated films like *Surf's Up* and *Penguins of Madagascar*. We capped it off with a nod to the wildlife documentaries that we all love - from *Wild Kingdom* to *Blue Planet* (or pretty much anything by David Attenborough) - and how they inform and inspire us about our natural world.



Tone

Northern Tails is a high-spirited series that is informative and amusing. It's quirky, sure, but it's also heartwarming and inspiring in a way that makes us all see how we can be better neighbours. The dialogue and character interactions add playful elements that make the facts (slap)stick.



Style

Education meets imagination with a throwback production style that is a nod to simpler times and science basics.

The digital shorts are filmed in a studio using constructed sets that combine hand-painted backgrounds and natural and felted props to create a soft, whimsical environment.

The puppets are designed with materials you could find in a kid's dress—up trunk, embellished with accessories that accent their biological personality traits — nerdy glasses, fanciful flowers, frosted tips!

Sound is important to our story. We mix the natural soundscape of the Boreal Forest with comedic audio cues and a retro soundtrack that will connect with parents and the Tik-Tok generation.



Themes

Learning is fun! Knowledge is power! These educational shorts show how northern animals interact with each other, their environment, people and the wider world, but without being overly serious. Through the series we'll learn:

WHO LIVES IN THE BOREAL FOREST?

We'll learn about the most important species in the Boreal Forest and what role they play in their community.

WHY IS THE BOREAL FOREST IMPORTANT?

Everyone knows about the Arctic, but the swampy muskeg and thick forests of the boreal — while not as photogenic — are true superstars of the planet's health.

HOW IS THE BOREAL FOREST CHANGING?

Shifts in climate and increased human development are making things different for animals and plants of the Boreal Forest. How (and if) they adapt is important to all of us.



Concept

Wildlife documentaries are a family favourite. They are a great way to learn about our natural world but they are usually very serious and sometimes even unsettling for younger children.

Using friendly puppets and a "mockumentary" format, *Northern Tails* is crafted to capture the hearts and minds of curious kids with an age-appropriate approach to learning.

As each episode eavesdrops on the lives of the characters, a narrative unfolds and science becomes a subtle subplot. In the end, the audience can relate to the story and understand more about important eco—connections in the real world.



Did you know that the Boreal Forest is bigger than the Amazon?!! With a billion acres across Northern Canada, crawling with thousands of creatures (and very few people) and streaming with the most surface freshwater in the world, the boreal ecosystem is a super-influencer for the health of the entire planet. As we explore this vast land with a motley crew of characters, we can learn what our wild neighbours do for us and what they need to survive.



Characters

Meet the cast (and crew) of *Northern Tails!* They all play important roles in the Boreal Forest. Each character is developed using key biological and behavioral characteristics of the species, and a dash of pop culture references to make them relatable and fun.


